What Would You Do?

Here's another ethical dilemma for you to ponder.

A new patient presents to a general dentist. The dentist obtains the patient's medical history: The patient is a 55-year-old male who had a total hip replacement performed four years prior. The patient has no other medical issues. The patient informs the dentist that his orthopedic surgeon advised him to take antibiotics prior to any dental work. According to the patient, the orthopedic surgeon stressed that if he did not take antibiotics, his "new" hip could become infected, potentially leading to removing and replacing that hip yet again. The patient expresses his reluctance by adding, "There is no way I want to go through that!"

The dentist performs a complete clinical and radiographic examination. A treatment plan is formulated that involves prophylaxis, several restorations, root canals, and crowns. After a thorough discussion, the patient agrees to have the necessary work performed and makes several appointments to get started. Before leaving, the patient requests that the dentist give him a prescription for antibiotics so he can pre-medicate as his orthopedist recommended.
